### Montgomery County Community College ART 101 Art History: Cave Painting to Pre-Renaissance 3-3-0

## COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A survey of Western visual arts and architecture from the earliest examples of cave painting and sculpture to the beginning of the Renaissance in Europe in the 15<sup>th</sup> century. Masterworks in painting, sculpture and architecture are examined as individual aesthetic works and in relationship to their historical and social contexts. Comparative study of diverse civilizations will be explored through the works of great visual artists and architects offering students a broader perspective of human experience throughout the historical periods covered.
