Addendum I: Articulation Agreement

This Articulation Agreement is an addendum to the existing Dual Admissions (DA) agreement between Montgomery County Community College (MCCC) and Rosemont College (RC). The intent of this addendum is to add the baccalaureate degree programs offered in the Rosemont College Schools of Graduate and Professional Studies (SGPS).

To be eligible to take advantage of this articulation agreement, the following terms and conditions must be met:

1. A student will graduate from MCCC with an Associate in Business Administration, Management, Marketing, Criminal Justice or Emergency Management & Planning with a minimum GPA of 2.0.

The following associate degree programs at MCCC are designated as part of the articulation agreement. MCCC students completing one of these degrees may transfer into the parallel RC program. All RC SGPS undergraduate majors require 120 credits:

Note: Additional programs may be identified and defined under the terms of this agreement.

- 2. A maximum of 84 qualifying credits will transfer to SGPS. Students must have achieved a grade of "C" or above for any courses to be transferred to RC; including courses transferred to and accepted by MCCC from other institutions.
- 3. Complete a minimum of 36 credits in the including at least half of the requirements for the major or area of specialization to earn a Rosemont College degree. Comprehensive examinations and/or any special examinations required for licensure and/or certification programs must also be completed at Rosemont.
- 4. A student must maintain a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 for the credits completed at Rosemont College.
- 5. Students who have pursued a MCCC associate's program of study other than those designated in this agreement and who wish to transfer to RC may still be considered for admissions on an individual basis and their credits will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.

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- 6. MCCC and Rosemont College agree to share graduating student data for the purpose of identifying and contacting students who would be eligible for this articulation agreement. Information will be released during the semester in which the student is expected to graduate.
- 7. MCCC transfer students are eligible to receive a tuition scholarship based on their MCCC transfer Grade Point Average (GPA). The scholarship applied upon enrollment is applicable throughout degree completion at RC.

Students who submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) may also be eligible to receive other types of financial aid. If a student is eligible for a Tuition Discount based on another agreement, only one discount may be applied.

This agreement will automatically renew unless personnel from MCCC and RC determine that a meeting is necessary to review and/or amend this Addendum. Either institution may terminate this Addendum at any time by written notice within 90 days.

The undersigned representatives of the parties, Montgomery County Community College and Rosemont College, have executed this Addendum to the existing Dual Admissions Agreement on the dates indicated.
